



Project 3 – Hanukkah Scrapbook

Materials

- 6–10 sheets of card stock
- 1 sheet of sticker paper or HP Restickables
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Tape
- Felt tip pens
- Materials for your scrapbook, like photos, scraps of wrapping paper, invitations, etc.

Instructions

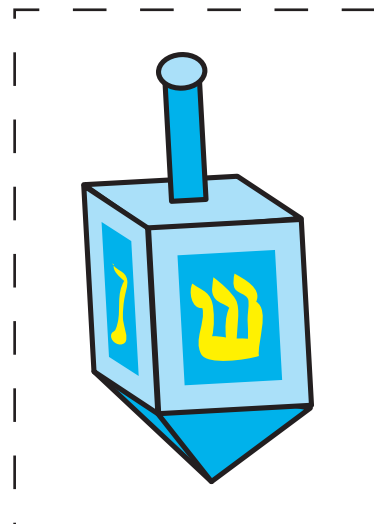
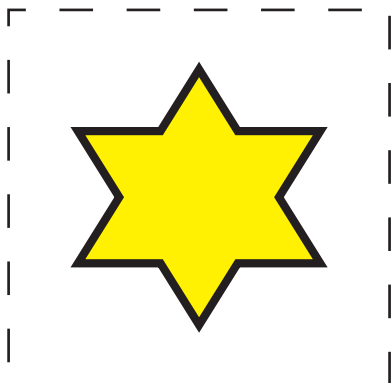
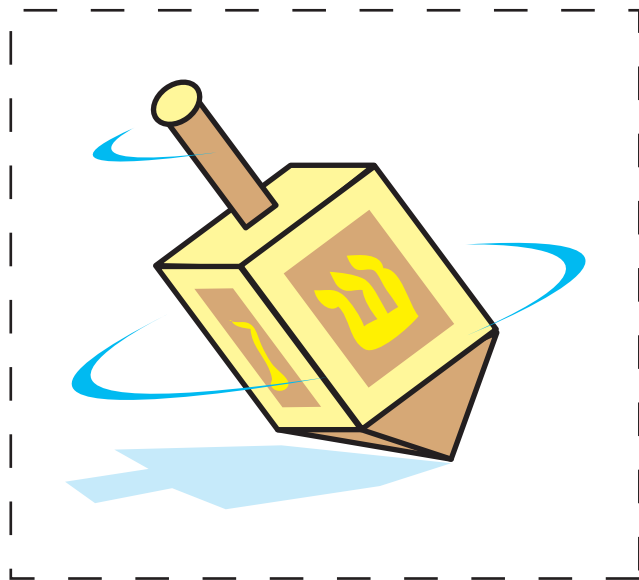
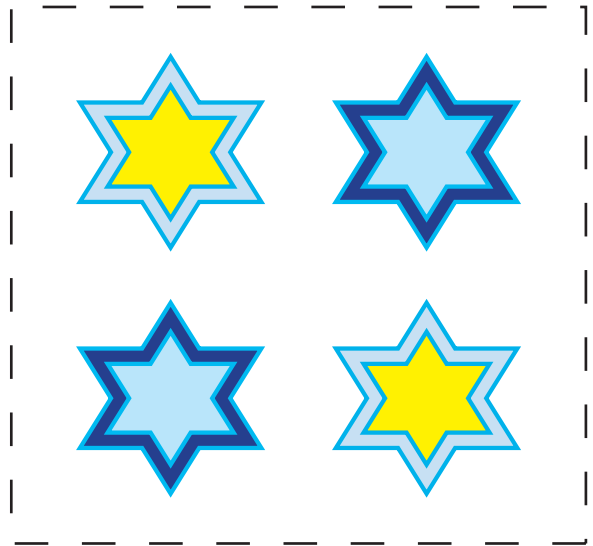
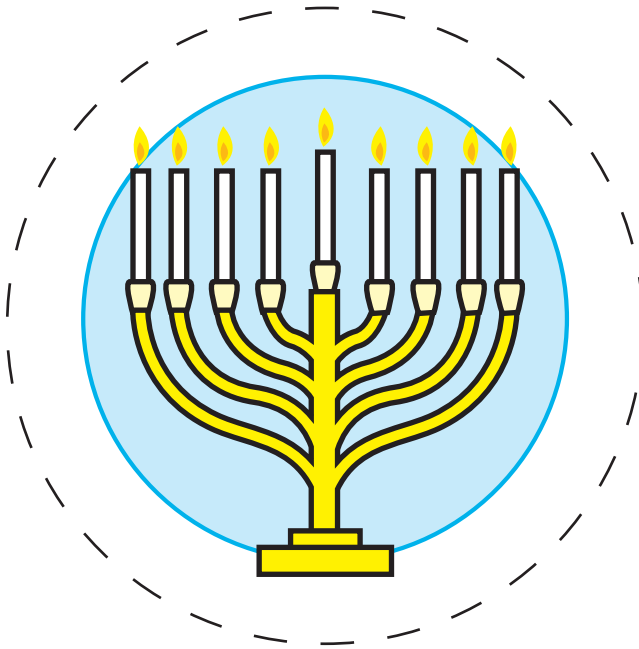
1. Print the sticker page on sticker paper or HP Restickables. Set aside to dry completely.
2. Print the rest of the artwork on card stock. Set aside to dry completely. (You may want to print several copies of some pages.)
3. Fill in the blanks on the cover, movie and party pages.
4. Be creative in placing objects in your scrapbook. Arrange your photos, clippings, mementos, notes, etc., before gluing or taping them down. Use the "say cheese" page to paste your favorite everyday photos in a collage. Let the glued materials dry completely.
5. Remember—this is a work in progress, so don't bind your scrapbook together permanently until it is complete. You may want to rearrange the pages after you've put them all in.

Binding suggestions

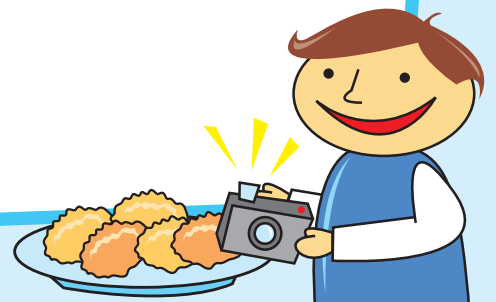
- Punch holes on the left side of your scrapbook pages (you can buy decorative punches in all sorts of fun shapes). Thread short lengths of ribbon through the holes and tie them in loose bows.
- Using a three-ring binder with a clear pocket on the front, put the cover page in the pocket and then punch three holes in the left side of your scrapbook pages. Place them inside the binder.
- Have your scrapbook professionally bound at a copy shop.

Why not design some of your own pages? The possibilities are endless: Use photos, scraps of material, foil, specialty papers, colored markers, or even paint. Be creative!
